News from Mark in Ottawa: Jobs and Growth

I am happy to be back in Ottawa for this new session of Parliament. Budget 2010 came down recently and is the highlight of the political season.

Budget 2010 continues to build on Canada's Economic Action Plan which has helped Canada through the most difficult economic downturn since the 1930's. Budget 2010 injects \$19-billion of new stimulus to create and protect jobs, secure Canada's economic recovery and sustain our economic advantage through:

- Personal income tax relief (\$3.2 billion): adjustments to federal tax brackets, enhancing the Working Income Tax Benefit, higher child benefits for parents and lower taxes for low- and middle-income seniors
- Re-training & worker support (over \$4 billion): enhancing EI benefits and training opportunities to transition workers from current challenges towards future prosperity
- Infrastructure (\$7.7 billion): to create jobs, modernize infrastructure, support home ownership, stimulate the housing sector, and improve housing across Canada
- R&D (over \$1.9 billion): developing and attracting talent, strengthening research capacity, improving commercialization, accelerating private sector investment, expanding market access and competitiveness to build the economy of tomorrow
- Targeted support to industries and communities (\$2.2 billion): helping create and maintain jobs in sectors like forestry, agriculture, small business, tourism, and culture

Budget 2010 helps protect jobs today, and create the jobs and economy of tomorrow by:

- **Supporting Workers:** Investing \$100 million to extend the maximum length for work-sharing agreements
- **Helping Young Workers:** Offering over \$100 million in support to young workers through internships and skills development to help them find jobs
- **Investing in R&D:** Delivering over \$600 million to help develop and attract high-quality jobs, to strengthen our capacity for world-leading research and development, and to improve the commercialization of research
- Strengthening Manufacturers: Making Canada a tariff-free zone for manufacturing inputs to boost new investment and job creation
- **Supporting businesses:** Establishing a Red Tape Reduction Panel to reduce paperwork for business
